### Hribar's son Joe wins Sports Emmy for design

Joseph Hribar, a native of Lorain, was part of the Creative Services group at ESPN that received a Sports Emmy for Outstanding Graphic Design. They won for their design of ESPN's SportsNation. The one-hour weekday program airs on ESPN2 at 4 p.m. ET and debuted last July.

"Receiving such an honor and taking part in the entire experience of the ceremony is certainly a high point in my young career," said Hribar. "Sharing this honor with the very talented and hardworking people I work with gives me great joy."

Hribar, who works as a broadcast graphics developer, has been with ESPN since April 2008. He graduated from Mount Union College in Alliance, Ohio in 2005, and received a masters in fine arts degree in computer graphics design in 2007 from the Rochester Institute of Technology.

He designs visuals for the touch screens used by anchors throughout the hour-long cable show. He programs touchscreen layouts that help the hosts of ESPN show viewers NBA playoff brackets and NFL drafts. Some of the busiest days, though, involved handling ESPN's coverage of the Tiger Woods scandal along with LeBron James leaving the Cleveland Cavaliers.

Hribar is the son of UAW Local 2000's Financial Secretary Joe Hribar and his wife Cheryl.
